Many of our church members have lost their loved ones in the recent wave of Covid infections. Requesting the church to uphold all members who have suffered losses in their respective paryers



Renew our thinking

I want to share a story about a baby elephant that was tied to a wooden post. Tied to a post for several days, the baby elephant tried to break free of the rope holding him down but was unsuccessful. Day after day, he tried to break free. After several months, he could not still break free of the rope and give up hope of breaking the rope. Years go by, yet the now-adult elephant stays obediently tied to the wooden post each day. The wooden post remains the same, yet the elephant had lost all confidence in his ability to break free, such that he has stopped even trying to break the rope.

The mindset described above is called "habitual thinking" and is a relatively stable and stereotyped way of thinking. We each have our own perspective that often limits our thinking and behaviours, leading us into making improper judgments.


The Bible says, "Don't imitate the world, but renew your mind and change so that you can test what God's good, pure, and pleasing will is." (Romans 12:2). God's way of thinking and His words break our inherent thinking processes, renewing our thoughts. The Word of God allows us to renew our thinking to become more like Him, seeing and thinking from His perspective.

When we start to think like Him, we will also start acting like Him. When we allow Christ to come into our hearts, we are reborn, and God's way of thinking replaces our previous ways of thinking. God wants us to become beacons of his glory through our renewed thinking that we may see and think in the same way He sees the world.

Think in God's way. Gradually, when we allow our mode of thinking to change, we will find that we understand the answers God provides when we face various situations in our lives. Using the biblical way of thinking, we can understand that suffering is by no means God's punishment and judgment on mankind. Let us not linger in our old ways of thinking; instead, let us meditate on God's Word every day to renew our minds. Seek God's will in everything you do, and he will give you the desires of your heart.
