PASTORS COLUMN:

Pastor Mike: What is required for revival?

That is a very broad question, and yet it requires very specific answers, and there are many. In 1932, revival came to North China through the prayers of a single woman missionary, Marie Monsen. Marie was a Norwegian missionary, and was feeling very discouraged by the lack of progress in her missionary field, and she wondered what good her ministry was actually doing. She longed to see God's river of life flowing through the parched souls in the land of North China. So, she sought out another prayer person. Two years later, the revival began in a town where 40 Christians were meeting for prayer. God's Word began to catch fire in the hearts of the local people, and many people believed and understood the saving Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ!

Praise the Lord that He tells us in His Word, that He is willing to revive our hearts toward Him.

"And it shall be said, "Build up, build up, prepare the way, remove every obstruction from my people's way. For thus says the One who is high and lifted up, who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy: "I dwell in the high and holy place, and also with him who is of a contrite and lowly spirit, to revive the spirit of the lowly, and to revive the heart of the contrite."" - Isaiah 57:14-15

From these verses, we catch a glimpse of the great work that God wants to do in our lives through *Revival*. Notice these following 3 aspects...

1. A Holy Focus - "For thus says the One who is high and lifted up, who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy: "I dwell in the high and holy place..."

As long as our focus is turned inward, we will not see revival. We don't just need a *glimpse*, but a *fresh focus* on the holiness and greatness of our eternal God.

Pride is the idolatry of self, which is the "inward focus". To experience revival, we must once again give Christ preeminence in our lives, so that His life will shine *outwards* from us, for all to see.

2. A Humble Fellowship - "I dwell in the high and holy place, and also with him who is of a contrite and lowly spirit..."

These words remind us that those with a contrite and humble spirit can have a special awareness and fellowship with God's presence and power. Notice that it doesn't say a "concrete" spirit, but a "contrite" spirit!

When we are filled with ourselves, we see no need for God, or to be humble. But a contrite heart will be repentant of sin and self. It will be *re-focused* on God and *revived by Him and for Him!*

3. A Hopeful Future -"...to revive the spirit of the lowly, and to revive the heart of the contrite."


Revival has a lot to do with *restoration* and *renewed relationship* with God in a fresh way. It is a time of the removal from the "old deadness" and in with a time of "new life - ness". But as Leonard Ravenhill once said, "As long as we are content to live without revival, we will." Or, we can ask God for a holy discontent and hunger for anything less than His reviving work in our hearts, and through our lives.

As Jesus said "Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.'" - John 7:38.

My prayer is this..."Lord, let the rivers of living water flow from OCBC!" God bless everyone.
